

### Crime & Delinquency

MDFT decreases crime and delinquency significantly more than standard treatments and has been successfully studied and implemented in juvenile justice settings.

- <u>Canada's National Crime Prevention Centre</u> and the <u>Dutch Youth Institute</u> recognize MDFT as an effective intervention for juvenile delinquency








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

Juvenile Drug Court Study


MDFTCommunity Drug Treatment




#### MDFT in the Community
